Use Luigi, the Spider Who Wanted to Be a Kitten in your classroom to talk about the importance of being true to yourself and for accepting others just the way they are.



LUGI The Spider Who Wanted to Be a Kitten

- Luigi was afraid Betty wouldn't like him
 if she found out he was really a spider
 and not a kitten. Ask students if they've
 ever pretended to be someone they aren't
 because they thought it would make people
 like them more.
- Luigi liked some things about being a kitten, but not all of them. Ask students whether they think Luigi would have been happy pretending to be a kitten forever. Would Betty have been happy if Luigi kept on pretending to be a kitten?

- Discuss why it's important to be true to yourself and to accept others just the way they are.
- Share *The Library Lion* with students and talk about any similarities or connections between the two stories.
