





## The Five Sides of Marjorie Rice: How to Discover a Shape

- Send your students on a "shape hunt" around the classroom or school and ask them to make lists of all the shapes they see.
- Have your students come up with their own unique shapes. Ask them what they would name their shapes and why.
- Ask the students what their favorite shape is and why.
- Provide the students with cutouts of different shapes and ask them to observe which shapes fit together and which don't.
- Have your students try out the "How to Discover a Shape" ideas at the end of the book. Start with the "Explore Three-Sided Shapes" activity and have them create their own tessellating mosaic designs.
